St Winnold's Day Parade – Friday 22nd March

For those of you who may be new to Downham Market, or not familiar with some of its traditions, please see below. St Winnold's Parade is really quite special and unique, and is well worth watching. St Winnold is closely associated with Downham Market and he features on the town's sign. For many years a huge horse fair, one of the biggest in the country, was held on the feast day of St Winnold. The annual St Winnold's Parade sees Downham Market commemorating the granting of its market charter in 1046. A procession of local dignitaries around the town takes place including ponies and traps, all led by a Shire horse, which is truly magnificent.

Pupils in Classes 3 & 4 have been invited to take part in the parade and will be preparing some Art work to take with them. The office will send out a separate letter to those pupils involved, with further details.

Easter Egg Raffle - Lucky Squares

We have a large Easter picture covered in squares. Children can buy a square and will win an Easter Egg/prize if they pick a winning square. The squares cost 50p each and are on sale every morning before school, outside the entrance to the walkway. The last day to buy a square will be Thursday 21st March. The winner will be announced on Friday 22nd.

The **Nursery** will have their Lucky Squares board on display by their entrance. The last day to buy from their square will be Tuesday 26th March, for the draw on Wednesday 27th.

Funds raised go towards buying the prizes for the lucky squares and the eggs for the egg rolling competition and egg hunt in the school garden. The draw takes place on the last day of term.

Easter Egg Roll (Prep school)

We will be holding the traditional Easter egg rolling competition on Friday 22nd March. Below is some helpful information for those of you who have only recently joined the school and are not familiar with this event.

Each child brings in an uncooked hen's egg in a box and leaves it in their form room when they arrive in the morning. Please do not paint the egg or dip it in vinegar. Please put the child's name on the box and name or initials on the egg. Each class roll their eggs down a slope until only the 'champion' egg survives. The winner from each class then takes part in the final to find the 'champion' egg for the whole school. The winner of each class wins a small egg as a prize, and the overall champion wins a larger egg.

Egg Hunt (Prep school)

We also have an Easter Egg Hunt. We hide Easter bunnies, made of card, in the garden for the children to find. These are then exchanged for a small chocolate egg. This will also be held on Friday 22nd March.

Cross-Country Report – by Mr Lane

The sixth and final Ryston Runners Cross Country Grand Prix event took place at Shouldham Warren on Sunday 10th March.

Unfortunately, it clashed with Mothering Sunday, so, understandably, it proved difficult to persuade pupils to come. We also had to contend with light rain for this one. However, 4 pupils did make it.

In the Under 9 Girls' race Freya completed a very good season, finishing in her highest ever position of 11th in 4 mins 13 seconds, only 1 second off her fastest ever time. Frankie finished 15th, equalling her personal best time of 4 mins 37 seconds.

The Under 9 Boys' race had our other two competitors. Benjamin finished in 11th, in a time of 3 mins 37 seconds and Alfie in 16th, in a time of 3 mins 52 seconds.

With regards to the Schools Trophy Competition, at the start of the event we were 4th, only 2 points behind Hillcrest in 3rd. Alas, with only 4 runners, we couldn't amass enough points to overhaul them, and therefore we finished 4th out of the 15 Schools that took part. Considering how small our school is, that's still quite an achievement.

I attended the awards ceremony that followed the completion of the last race, which took place at the newly refurbished Shouldham Bowls and Social Club. All runners that completed at least 3 of the runs gain a memento of the Grand Prix Series – a lovely wooden coaster. That means Violet and Ezra gained one of those as well as the four that ran in the last event.

Well done to those 6 pupils, and to all the pupils that took part in a race this season!
