Netball Reports - by Mrs Rockcliffe

1) U11 Netball v The Glebe – Wednesday 13th March

Last Wednesday we travelled to Glebe House School at Hunstanton with 2 mixed 5-a-side Netball teams. The time was divided up into 7 x 7ths. The team rotated around positions every time play stopped, giving each player a go at shooting, defending and playing centre court.

Team 1 - Ivy, Callum, Freddie, Steviena and Sam.

The team showed some great passing and moving. They struggled with focus and attention at times, allowing easy passes to get past them. We also need to do some more work on man-to-man marking. Glebe broke ahead at the beginning, leading 4-0. Throughout the match Downham played well as a team bringing the score back to 5-4. The final score was 8-5 to Glebe.

Glebe awarded Callum player of the match - well done. And well done to Mr Tierney for umpiring his first netball match.

Team 2 - Armaan, Emily, Veeve, Blake, Megan and Sienna.

The team started well, but were a little nervous. The defence played well, but we needed more jumping in the circle.

2) Year 3/4 Bee Netball SSP Development tournament - Thursday 14th March

Last Thursday we took 2 teams to play in the Partnership's primary school Bee Netball tournament, in order to develop their netball skills. In Years 3/4 this is known as Fliers and the children play adapted rules to introduce them to netball. The idea behind the development tournaments are that no scores are kept and it's all about having fun and developing skills.

Team 1 - Billy, Maddie, Isabel and Archie played 8 games in total. They started a little cautiously in the first game, but linked some great passes and the final score was a 1-1 draw. After this they found there groove and played really well as a team. Maddie was super scorer and Billy, Isabel and Archie moved the ball around the court well. They won all the other matches convincingly and didn't concede another goal all afternoon. A very pleasing set of games.
